- Store bought cards can be used. Most 99¢ stores sell holiday cards for 99¢ for a pack of 12 or 18 cards, or use up last year's cards. If you use store-bought cards, do not place the cards in envelopes. In fact, we don't need the envelopes. Cards will be inside the gift stockings.

- Please do not use glitter. It gets everywhere.
- Some soldiers may wish to contact the students who write to them. If you like, you may include the school's address in your cards. Please do not include the children's home address.
